## MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Good Day Oly Nation,

We would like to thank our teachers, patrons and parents for the support they give to Sprague High School and our students. We had a significant amount of bond work done this past summer and the school is looking great.

Our teachers and students are adjusting to the new 7 period day and some teachers have adopted a standards based grading model. This new grading system caused some initial confusion and we would like to expand on this topic to help clarify why this transition is taking place.

Standards based grading, sometimes referred to as "proficiency grading", requires the student to demonstrate knowledge on various standards. Because the model requires that students demonstrate that they are "proficient" in a certain standard, it requires students to "know" the material. This grading model helps support your child's preparation for their state exams as it reflects similar traits as the state exams. This is very important because students are required to pass the OAKS standard based "assessments" in order to graduate.

Other grading systems in the past have included variables such as participation, homework completion, etc. as large quantities factored into the students grade. In these cases, students could score C's and D's on tests and A's on homework and might end up with a "B" for their final grade, however, they have not mastered the concepts as evidenced by their low test scores. The standard based grading model is assessment (test) based and requires students to pass the assessment as the key variable in their letter grade.

It is important for students and parents to also understand that early in the semester a student may have had fewer successful attempts at demonstrating "proficiency" on any given standard, and thus, a lower letter grade is given to the student than the student is used to receiving. As the semester unfolds, the student's letter grade will increase as the student will have completed more opportunities to demonstrate proficiency and pass more of the assessments. They have had the time to master the material and demonstrate that they "know" the skill versus having "done" the skill.

We hope this letter helps students and parents in understanding both how the Standards Based Grading Model works and how this system of grading supports students in meeting their graduation requirements. If you have questions regarding your child's grade or how your child's teacher is utilizing the Standards Based Assessment Model in their classroom we encourage you to communicate directly with your child's teacher. Thank you for your patience during this change, we look forward to helping your child receive an outstanding education while they attend Sprague High School.

- Students must make-up days that are canceled due to weather conditions.
- People are encouraged to listen to local news media and not call the School District. This helps the community receive up-to-date, accurate information very quickly and easily.
- If school is delayed by two hours, morning kindergarten will be cancelled.
- In the case of early dismissal due to weather conditions, each school has an emergency plan.
- **PLEASE NOTE** that the media will mention the District only if there is a delay or closure. If you do not hear any information, it is safe to assume that our schools are open or have resumed their regular schedules.

Salem-Keizer School District 24J is required by state law to keep a record of each student's immunizations. Parents who are enrolling a student in school must complete a Certificate of Immunization Status form with their child's record of immunizations. **Please have the dates of your student's immunizations with you at registration time.**

- Kindergarten students are not allowed to attend school until they have a minimum of one dose each of required vaccines.
- Students may be exempted from receiving certain immunizations for medical conditions or religious reasons.
- Students who are **NOT IN COMPLIANCE** will be excluded on **February 15, 2012**, Statewide Exclusion Day.

# ACTIVITIES

## Environmental Club Begins a Busy Year

This fall, a large number of Environmental Club students volunteered their Saturday to set up and monitor recycling bins for the annual Pacific Coast Invitational Band Tournament held at Sprague. Bins were placed inside and outside the buildings and in the stadium. Cans and bottles were recycled by club members throughout the day.



Another October project was cleaning Liberty Street between Boone and Holder. This is the first of three cleanups required to maintain the Adopt-a-Street status.

One of the main goals of the club is to raise awareness of the benefits of recycling. Recycling bins are located close to the main eating centers (Oly Lounge and cafeteria) with specific containers labeled for each type of recyclable material.



Food service staff collects left over fruits and vegetables for composting. Each day a club member takes the leftover food and places it in one of three compost bins located by the school's greenhouse. Club members periodically "turn" the compost; eventually the leftovers will become rich quality soil that the school can use for planting etc.



Mrs. Palmer's students recycle cans, bottles, and paper each Tuesday and Thursday and soon, Mrs. Davis's students will start recycling in "the pit". The Environmental Club greatly appreciates all of this help and participation but is seeking more individual staff and student involvement.



In November the club conducted their annual waste audit. A representative sample of school refuse is separated and weighed to determine the percentage of recyclable materials that are regularly thrown out as garbage. This year's audit showed an increased amount of

recyclables in the sample. The Club will use this information to evaluate how to increase and improve Sprague's Green School status.

Mrs. Redford for helping with the Liberty Street cleanup crew and a very special thank you to Ryan Topping who faithfully empties the kitchen compost every school day!

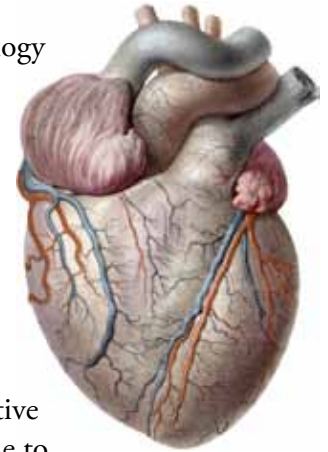

# Health Services NEWS

## Chest Watch

On Friday, October 29th, students from the Health Occupations I & II, Medical Terminology I, and Sports Medicine Practicum classes were invited by Providence St. Vincent's Hospital to participate in their Chest Watch program, where students were able to view an actual open heart surgery! Students left before the sun came up to watch the surgery and ask questions from the first cut to the suturing of the patient's chest.

Cardiac Surgeon Dr. Storm Floten, president of Starr-Wood Cardiac Group performed open heart surgery in the hospital's operating room and it was shown live in an auditorium for the students to observe. Cardiac Surgeon Dr. Anthony Furnary, Chief Operating Officer and senior surgeon at Starr-Wood Cardiac Group facilitated the discussion from the auditorium. During the surgery Dr. Floten replaced the patient's defective aortic valve with a replacement valve. In all, the surgery took 5 hours and students were able to handle an exact replica of the aortic valve replacement used in the surgery.



Throughout the process, an audio feed enabled students to question Dr. Floten in the operating room and allow Dr. Floten to talk to the students during the surgery. Several presenters including a pathologist, anesthesiologist, social worker, medical researcher and an OR nurse also came to the auditorium before, during, and after the surgery to talk about their profession, their role in the procedure, and to answer questions. Following the surgery, Dr. Floten returned to the auditorium to wrap up and answer any remaining questions about the procedure. During the entire process, students were able to ask the surgeon and nurse questions, in addition to learning about their professions and gain an interesting insight into the surgery process. A big thank you goes out to Providence and Dr. Floten!

## A New Physical Therapy Lab!

Sprague High School's Health Services Program now has the designation of being a Physical Therapy/Sports Medicine Specialty Program. With this specialization comes a new Physical Therapy Lab which will be in room 17. The lab will have actual exam tables and physical therapy equipment so students can learn the techniques that are being used in physical therapy and sports medicine practices.

Sprague's Sports Medicine, Advanced Sports Medicine, Health Occupations I & II, and Intro to Health Services classes will be in the lab putting the new equipment to use starting this January, 2012!

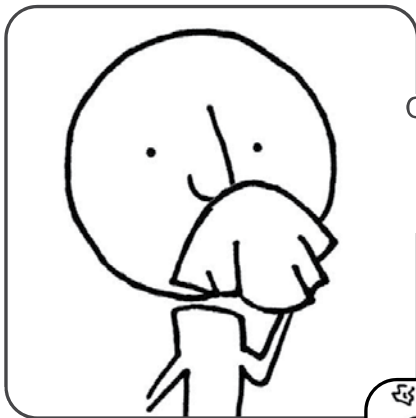


## KINDERVISIONS

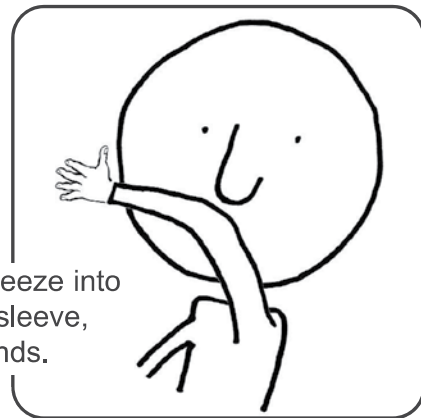

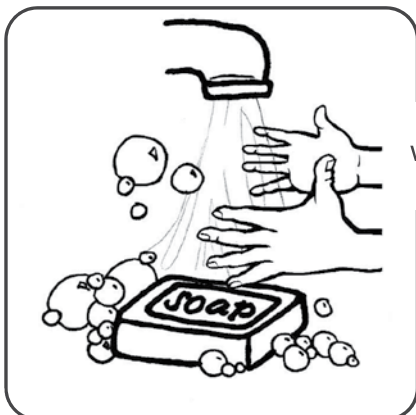

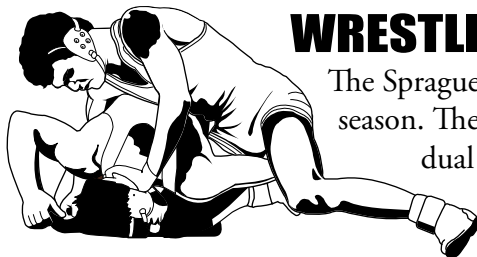
## “Build the Barn”
